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Academics – Diploma & High School Equivalency (HSE) Pathway

Introduction

Please join academics if your goal is to obtain your diploma or pass the equivalency exam. Many students are closer than they think.

Financial Benefits

Students who earn a diploma or pass the HSE exam can obtain higher wages at elevated levels of employment. Students with a diploma or HSE can earn an average of \$7,800 more per year than those students without one.

Why Academics?

Do you want to: make more money, go to college, join a union? Enrolling in academics is a great way to brighten your future.

Interested in a Union?

If you're interested in joining a labor union, most of them require a diploma or HSE certificate.

What do I need to earn a diploma?

Algebra (10 credits), Economics (5 credits), English (40 credits), Government (5 credits), Biological Science (10 credits), Math (20 credits), Physical Science (10 credits), U.S. History (10 credits), Visual/Performing Arts/CTE (10 credits), and World History (10 credits). CCAS has a 130-credit requirement which is less than most adult schools.

Academics

<u>Step 1:</u>

<u>Diploma/HSE Track:</u> Complete School Orientation Packet, including the Transcript Request Form. All academic students must have a transcript on file.

<u>Step 2:</u>

<u>Diploma/HSE Track:</u> Take (and pass) the CASAS (high school entrance test) provided by the instructional assistant (IA).

<u>Step 3:</u>

<u>Diploma/HSE Track</u>: Stay focused on your goals and commit to 3 hours of schoolwork, each weekday. Turn in your work consistently. Do your best. If you are having trouble, send an IR and ask questions. We are here to help you succeed.

<u>Step 4:</u>

<u>Diploma Track</u>: Completed work with a passing grade will earn subject matter credits that will be applied to your transcript.

<u>HSE Track:</u> Once you pass the pre-tests (five subjects: Reading, Writing, Science, Social Studies, and Math) our Testing & Transcript Analyst will create a schedule and timeline to administer the final exam.

<u>Step 5:</u>

<u>Diploma Track:</u> Once all diploma credit requirements are met, your transcript will be sent to the Contra Costa County Office of Education for diploma approval. CONGRATULATIONS, YOU DID IT.

HSE Track: Once you pass all five subjects, your HSE certificate will be sent to the address you provide on file. CONGRATULATIONS, YOU DID IT.

Class Offerings:

ESL (English as a Second Language): Prepares non-native English speakers to communicate better in English and enter mainstream English language classes.


ABE (Adult Basic Education): Reviews basic skills in reading, writing, and math. Students will increase competency levels in order to be promoted to the HSE or HSD programs.

HSE – High School Equivalency: Prepares students to take the GED/HiSET exam(s) and improve educational skill levels in all five subject areas (math, reading comprehension, writing, social science, and science).

ASE – Adult Secondary Education/High School Diploma:

Prepares students to complete all required credits based on most recent school transcript. Covers all areas of subject matter requirements.

COMMITMENT to CHANGE

"Catch Your Errors in Thinking"



Do you want to figure out why you keep ending up in that revolving door of acting before you think; saying yes in the moment when you already know the consequences; and finding yourself repeating the same old mistakes? Commitment to Change will help you learn the skills and gain self-confidence to stop and catch your thinking errors before you act and how to make better choices.

Phase 1

Errors in Thinking

- Identify errors in thinking, examine effects of thinking on behavior
- Taking responsibility for personal choices provides hope that change is possible
- Identify consequences of behavior
- Learn a model of change
- Catch thoughts before they become actions
- Identify a process for change

Phase 2

Tactics: Habits That Block Change

- Identify tactics used to shift focus from behaviors that block responsible change
- Identify the tactics of Casing People Out, Generalization, and Silence
- Identify how thoughts trigger actions and errors in thinking trigger tactics

Phase 3

Decisions & Consequences

- □ Understand why we seek trouble,
- Courage to See the Truth
- Learn why we ignore
- consequences, Super optimism
- Notice go-ahead thoughts
- Recognize the need to slow down, picture consequences, face temptation
- Learn why recovery begins now, who do you want to be, pulling it all together.



PARENTING

"Geared to Both Men & Women"

Triple P- Positive Parenting Program

There is no right way to be a parent or caregiver; it is up to each of us to decide what values and skills we would like ourchildren to have. The challenge, however is to raise healthy, well adjusted children in a loving, predictable environment. Our 8-week Positive Parenting class focuses on positive parenting as well as women's issues; topics include motivation, empowerment and self-care. This class provides parents with strategies that focus on why children misbehave, how to address it and how to help children grow and develop into competent and confident individuals.

Supporting Father Involvement (SFI)

This class is designed specifically for men around parenting strategies for the development of a child's life and how to take on each as a parent. The class covers a variety of men's issues, particularly incarcerated fathers. Topics include motivation, empowering relationships and self-care.

The SFI Parenting Program has valuable skills that will help with your reentry back into the community and been approved by the Courts if you are involved with custody issues, Children & Family Services (CFS) or Juvenile Court.

Modules 2-3 will help students identify their needs and set goals for a successful reentry. Individual Development Plan created.

Employment Preparation

Module 9-17: how to write a resume and cover letter, as well as interviewing skills and soft skills. Education and training opportunities are also covered.


